
Here are a few ways you'll notice these developments as they happen:



- - Begins to correctly use plurals, pronouns, and prepositions
 - Follows 2-3 step directions ٠ with concepts like "under," "behind," and "next to"
 - Uses a variety of sentences with four or more words to communicate ideas, needs, and wants
 - Says their full name, age, and gender

- Tells short stories and can describe something that has happened to them
- Sings songs and says rhymes from memory
- Communicates clearly enough to be understood by strangers
- Uses verbs ending in "ing"

- Carries on a full conversation with • other people
- Uses future tense and understands words for time, like "yesterday," "today," and "tomorrow"
- Talks in different ways, depending • on the listener and the place
